The Oregon Fire Service Honor Guard is a non-profit organization established in 1998 with the distinct mission of serving the members of the Oregon Fire Service. The Honor Guard recognizes those who have made the ultimate sacrifice by giving their lives in the line on duty. Members serve as a ceremonial unit for funerals, memorials and special events. The Honor Guard also oversees the Oregon Fallen Fire Fighters Memorial and ceremony.

The Honor Guard is represented by career and volunteer fire service professionals from across the State of Oregon, providing three levels of funeral services for members of the fire service. First is Line of Duty Death next is Active Duty Death services and then Retiree level services. The OFSHG does request small donation to cover expences like a casket flag and equipment or rooms if needed.

Active members of an Oregon fire agency are eligible for apply for membership.

- Member of a fire service organization within the State of Oregon.
- Cooperation from the member's supporting agency.
- Complete probation period of seven months.
- Pass final review with skills test and interview.
- Purchase of uniform once probation is completed (mandatory).
- Attend one statewide training session and one approved event per year (mandatory).
- No previous criminal record.
- Establish Worker's Compensation coverage from supporting agency while attending events and training. (mandatory)
- Ability to maintain competence in drill protocol and training.
- Members are responsible for all expenses including uniforms, travel, lodging and food.
- Conduct self in a professional, courteous and respectful manner consistent with an Honor Guard team.
- Maintain a high standard of dress and appearance.
- Maintain a neat and well groomed appearance while in uniform.
